Welcome

Dr Colin Kelman, Chair opened the meeting by thanking all for their attendance and introducing Eve Donelon, as the new Chief Executive Salford & Trafford LMC.

Eve introduced the structure of the evening in a short presentation that included the focus for the evening which was 'change' and the challenges and opportunities that presented.

New Models of Care: The Facts

Dr Tracey Vell, GP/CEO Manchester LMC/Chair GPAG/Assoc. Lead for primary and community care GMHSCP.

Dr Vell began by talking about the known challenges such as recruitment and the shift of secondary care work into primary care. She went on to talk about the development of new provider organisations and the choices practices can make on how they engage with them, i.e.

1. Sub contract
2. Be a co owner in a joint venture
3. Become an employee
4. Do nothing

She then went into more detail on what threats and opportunities each option presented.

Dr Vell concluded her presentation by talking about how the MCP model has been applied in Manchester.

New Care Models Programme – National team update

Tricia Hamilton, Senior Strategic Account Manager-North- New Models Of Care Programme.

Tricia's introduced the NHS Five Year forward View and how this is being delivered through the New Models of Care programme.

She talked about Vanguards and how the positive effects are showing in early results. These were noted as:

- Helping to reduce admissions
- Keeping people well in their place of choice
- Re shaping roles so that they are more rewarding & efficient

She went on to talk in more detail how the successful PACS/MCP and Care Homes Vanguards were emerging and how the National Model is supporting the Vanguards through the key enablers of their new care models.

She concluded by presenting examples of GP colleagues experiences and how to get further information on the 5yr forward view.

Tricia then introduced Dr Mark Williams who spoke briefly about local schemes from other areas and their positive impact on patient experience and admissions.

Change: Friend or foe? How to tackle it head on

After a brief insight in to the background of Oakridge and the objective behind the presentation for the evening, Brigit began by introducing the concept of VUCA when dealing with change.

Volatility
Uncertainty
Complexity
Ambiguity

She introduced the cycle of success, key skills required in an uncertain world and the four steps to successful change.

Practical exercises were introduced to the meeting to provoke thinking of how to deal with change.

She also talked about the different roles people adopt and what to do to ensure any change is successful.

- Engage everybody collaboratively from the onset
- Emphasise the positives
- Build leadership capabilities

Trafford Locality NMoC update

Dr Nigel Guest (Chief Clinical Officer, Trafford CCG)

Dr Guest began by introducing the vision of NMoC and the four main objectives:

- To deliver improved outcomes
- To ensure a sustainable system resilient to population growth
- To improve quality and experience
- To contribute to closing the financial gap

He then went on to give an overview of the Trafford NMoC programme and progress to date. He concluded by saying how several key success criteria had been introduced to understand and measure success.

Salford Locality NMoC update

Dr Neil Turton, Chief Executive, Salford Primary Care Together.

Dr Turton began by introducing 'The Case For Change' and the key achievements so far.

He went on to talk about what was happening in the neighbourhoods and future plans for delivery of services.

There was mention of the results from 'Taking the Temperature' and slides were presented on the % of practices who agreed/disagreed with the statements made in the exercise.

He concluded by outlining the next steps.
